

ENROLLMENT

For most programs to be conducted, a minimum enrollment must be reached. In addition, there is usually a maximum enrollment based on the facility size and the instructor's requirements. Therefore, registration is always on a first come, first serve basis. We encourage early registration.

INSURANCE


The City of Peekskill's Department of Recreation cannot, and does not provide medical insurance for participants in its programs.

TRIP POLICY

Sign up early. Trips may be canceled without sufficient registration.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Please listen to WLNA-1420 AM, WHUD-100.7 FM or call our hotline at 734-4228 for cancellation of programs due to inclement weather. Classes will be made up at the end of the session. **WHEN SCHOOLS ARE CLOSED, RECREATION PROGRAMS WILL BE CANCELED.**



REFUND POLICY

1. Refunds will **NOT** be given after a program begins.
2. Refunds can be requested for medical reasons. They must be in writing and they must be accompanied by a physician's note.
3. Refunds can be requested if the participant is moving from the City.
4. Refunds for personal reasons must be made in writing before the program ends. A \$10.00 processing fee will be charged.

RETURN CHECK POLICY

There will be a \$25.00 charge for returned checks.

HOW TO WATCH A GOOD PROGRAM BE ELIMINATED

Nothing kills a recreation program faster than residents who wait until the last minute to register. There is a point when a program must be canceled or modified if there is insufficient registration. All programs require a high level of coordination, often including facility scheduling, staffing, volunteer recruitment and purchasing of supplies. **PLEASE REGISTER EARLY.**

ID CARD AND RENEWAL FORM

Residents:

The Summer Season is rapidly approaching and it is time to renew your City Pool Passes. As you know, the City has instituted a policy which requires each person attending the Veterans Memorial Pool to have an Identification Card. These cards **MUST** be renewed **EACH** year. This year in order to better accommodate our Residents, we are offering a renewal of these cards through the mail. You will need to fill out the attached form and return all information as well as payment to the Recreation Department, 1 Robin Drive, Peekskill, NY 10566. We will renew your cards electronically (do **NOT** send us your ID cards) and mail you a receipt. If, however, you lost your ID card you **MUST** come into the office for a new card. We encourage you to take advantage of this service in order to avoid lines during our busy season. If you have any questions about this process, please call the Recreation Office at 734-7275. POOL PERMITS

ALL RESIDENTS AND NON-RESIDENTS MUST HAVE AN ID CARD TO ENTER THE POOL FACILITY ISSUED BY THE PEEKSKILL PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT. *THESE CARDS ARE FOR BOTH SEASONAL AND DAILY PASSES. TWO FORMS OF ID ARE NEEDED TO PROVE RESIDENCY. ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF ID ARE A DRIVERS LICENSE, CAR REGISTRATION, HOUSEHOLD BILL (TELEPHONE, CABLE, CON ED), MEDICARE/MEDICAID CARD WITH ADDRESS

An ID card is required to gain access to access the pool. This applies to residents, non-residents, season pass holders and for daily pool use. All persons over the age of 4 are required to have a photo ID card.

A pass holder must accompany guests or access to the pool facility will be denied.



SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM

Our mission is to identify and prioritize the needs of the elderly in Westchester; to create comprehensive and coordinated plans for meeting those needs; and to advocate for responsive policies, programs, actions, legislation and resources on behalf of the elderly.

The City of Peekskill Senior Nutrition Program is composed of two segments: meals served at congregate sites throughout the County and the home delivered meals program. Each meal provides at least 1/3 of the recommended dietary allowance (RDA) for an individual. Both programs are monitored by the Food and Nutrition Services Division, which plans the meals according to standards set by federal and state regulations and monitors the entire program to ensure compliance with federal, state and county regulations.

The NYS Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) aims to improve the well-being of those elderly who are at high nutritional risk, with particular emphasis on provision of services to the low income, minority, frail and isolated elderly.

Nutrition education and counseling are provided to seniors participating in either the congregate or home delivered meals programs. Materials and informational programs are provided on a regularly scheduled basis and designed to assist older persons in making proper choices of food in order to maintain good health through improved nutritional status.
